1. General Information

2. Abstract Submission Guidelines

- **Length:** The abstract should be between 250-300 words.
- **Content:** It must clearly state the **research problem, objectives, methodology, theoretical framework, and expected findings/key arguments.**
- **Format:**
 - Font: Times New Roman, 12 pt.
 - Spacing: 1.5 lines.
 - Include a list of 4-5 keywords.
 - The title should be concise and reflective of the content.
- **Author Details:**

On a separate page, include the following:

 - Full Name, Institutional Affiliation, Course/Degree Programme, Email Address, Contact Number.
 - The sub-theme for which the paper is being submitted.


