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Historical Background

The institution stands on a site steeped in history. The building, dating back to the 1850s, was originally known as the Elysium Lodge and served multiple purposes over time.

It later came into the possession of Raja Padam Chandra of Jubbal, a noted philanthropist, who dedicated it to the cause of higher education.

A degree college was established here in 1945, and in 1957, it was reorganized as Rana Padam Chandra Sanatan Dharam Bhargava College. The college was taken over by the Government of Himachal Pradesh in 1977 and was transformed into an exclusive girls' college in 1978, acquiring its present name.

Since then, the institution has steadily evolved into a premier centre of learning.

Academic and Institutional Profile

Initially offering programmes in Humanities and Sciences, the college soon expanded to include Commerce and a variety of professional and self-financing courses, such as BCA, Biotechnology, Microbiology, Journalism and Mass Communication, Travel and Tourism, and Fine Arts.

In 2024, postgraduate programmes in Commerce, English, History, and Political Science were introduced, marking a significant academic milestone.

The college also runs Sandhya Sangeet Mahavidyalaya, affiliated with Bhatkhande Sangeet Vidyapeeth, Lucknow, offering training and degree courses in classical music and dance.

Infrastructure and Student Development

RKMV provides a well-developed campus with modern classrooms, laboratories, computer and language labs, a computerized library, auditorium, gymnasium, canteen, and hostel facilities.

Students are encouraged to participate in co-curricular and extension activities such as NSS, NCC, Bharat Scouts and Guides, Eco Club, Red Cross, and Rotaract Club, which help in nurturing leadership, discipline, and social responsibility.

BCA (Bachelor of Computer Application)

The Bachelor of Computer Applications (BCA) is a three-year degree course introduced from the academic session 2015–16 onwards under a self-financing scheme. The program is divided into six semesters and leads to the award of the degree of Bachelor of Computer Applications from Himachal Pradesh University. Admission to the course is offered under two categories of seats: Subsidized and Non-Subsidized. The total intake capacity for the BCA course is 60 seats.

Eligibility

Candidates who have passed the 10+2 examination from H.P. Board/CBSE/ICSE or any other examination considered equivalent to 10+2, by the Himachal Pradesh University, Shimla-5, with 40% Marks (35% marks for SC/ST category), shall be eligible.

Age Limit

The maximum age limit for admission to the BCA course is 21 years for the general category, 24 years for the SC/ST category, and 23 years for female candidates, as of the 1st July of the year concerned. The Vice Chancellor may permit age relaxation of up to 3 months.

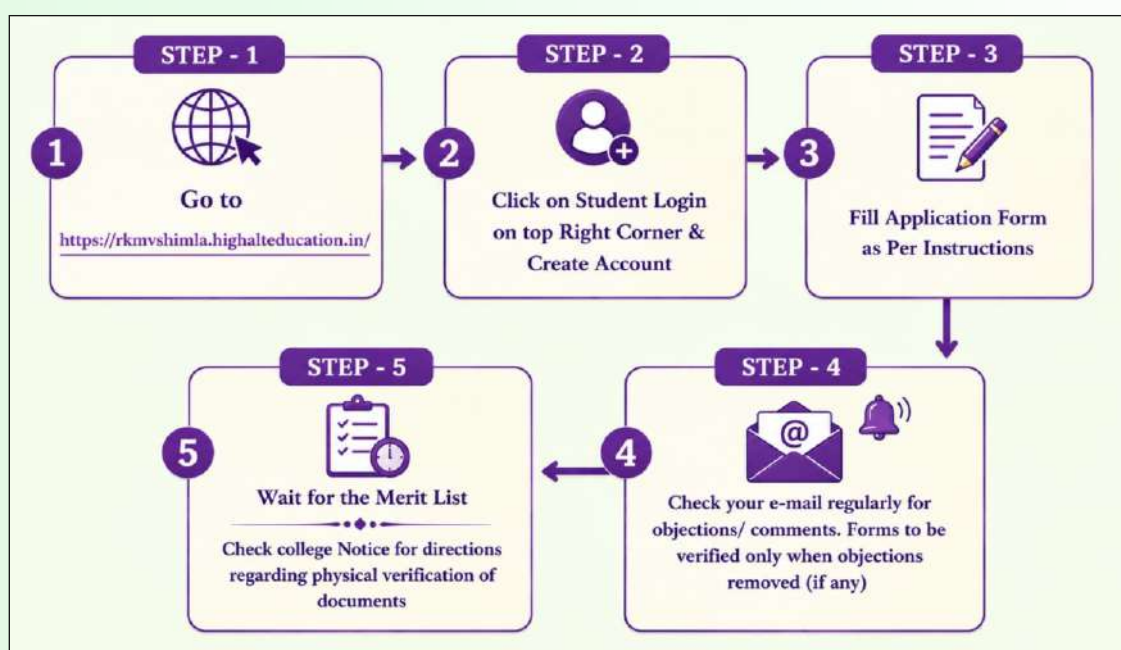


Admission Procedure

Candidates seeking admission to the BCA Course are advised to read all instructions carefully before filling out the admission form. Admission to the course will be carried out strictly according to the rules and regulations of Himachal Pradesh University and the college administration.

1. A candidate seeking admission to the First Semester of the BCA Course must apply online through the official college website. The application form should be completed carefully in all respects on or before **20th June 2026**.
2. Before applying for admission, students must obtain an **APAAR (Automated Permanent Academic Account Registry) ID**, as per the guidelines issued under **NEP 2020**.
3. Students are advised not to miss any admission-related updates. After the online submission of the form, applicants should regularly check their SMS messages and e-mail notifications for any comment/discrepancy removal so as to complete form verification before the last day of admission.
4. After selection in the merit list, candidates must report to the college in person with all original documents for verification.
5. Only those candidates whose documents are successfully verified by the college authorities shall be considered eligible for fee submission and confirmation of admission.
6. Admission shall be finalized only after the successful verification of documents and payment of the prescribed fee within the stipulated time period.

Steps to Apply Online



Documents/certificates required to be uploaded and deposited on the day of physical verification

1. Matriculation certificate for date of birth.
2. 10+2-mark sheet (Internet copy not accepted).
3. Passport-size photograph.
4. Character certificate in original from the Head of the Institution last attended in case of regular candidates. A character certificate shall be issued by a gazetted officer or the panchayat pradhan in the case of private candidates. The character certificate should not be older than six months on the day of submission of the admission form.
5. Certificates issued by a competent authority for availing the benefit of reservation or relaxation in age in the category concerned, i.e., SC/ST/OBC/Person with Disabilities/ Economically Weaker Section/Ex-Serviceman (or EWS)/Ward of Freedom Fighter.
6. Any gap in the academic career of an applicant must be supported by documentary evidence/affidavit as proof of his/her activities during the period of the gap.
7. H.P. Domicile certificate for exemption of tuition fee (for female candidates only).
8. An equivalence eligibility certificate from H.P. Board/H.P. University for the candidates who have passed 10+2 from a board other than the H.P. Board of School Education/CBSE/ICSE.
9. Migration certificates need to be submitted by candidates coming from boards/universities other than the H.P. Board of School Education/H.P. University.

Basis of Admission

- Admission to the BCA-I semester shall be made based on merit.
- Separate merit lists shall be prepared for the subsidized and non-subsidized categories.
- The 30 subsidized seats shall be filled first, and the remaining 30 seats in the self-financing category shall be filled after all the seats in the subsidized category are filled.
- NRIs/NRI-sponsored candidates can apply for admission only in the non-subsidized category
- There is no provision for reservation in the non-subsidized category.

Note: The roster for the reservation of seats for various categories shall be as per the rules of H.P. University.



- All the applicants are advised to see the College website for any changes in the schedule.
- Claim to the admission will stand cancelled if a candidate fails to report for counselling on the date and time mentioned in the prospectus.
- If a candidate is selected for admission after counselling, she will be required to deposit the fee immediately on the date and time mentioned; otherwise, her claim for admission will stand cancelled, and the seat will be allotted to the next candidate in the merit list.
- Hostel Facility Available (only limited seats are available on the merit basis).
- The first list of short-listed candidates shall be displayed on the college website or the college notice board on 20 June 2026 at 4.00 p.m.
- Short-listed candidates shall have to deposit the dues between 21 June 2026 and 22 June 2026 after getting their certificates verified and admission approved by the admission committee.

Note: As per university rules, 75% seats will be filled by the candidate who have passed their 10+2 examination from the schools situated in Himachal Pradesh irrespective of the Board. Remaining 25% seats will be filled on an all-India basis.

Roll-on Admission

Admission to the third Semester and fifth Semester of BCA shall be on a Roll-on basis. Without waiting for their university results, the students must fill in the admission form, attach relevant documents, and seek admission to the next higher class as per the admission schedule of H.P. University.

Important instructions:

- All the students of BCA third Semester and Fifth Semester are directed to pay the college fee under the roll-on system well within the notified dates.
- No one will be permitted to attend the classes without depositing the prescribed fee.
- Lectures attended under the roll-on system will also be counted for determining eligibility to appear in the final examination.
- All admissions under the roll-on system are provisional, and the admission of a student who fails to fulfill eligibility criteria after the declaration of the University result will stand automatically cancelled.
- Fees once deposited shall not be refunded.
- It is mandatory for all the students getting admission based on the roll-on system to get their admission regularised within ten days of the declaration of the university result.

Post Graduate Diploma in Computer Applications (PGDCA)

PGDCA is a one-year diploma course split over two semesters, leading to the award of a Diploma in Computer Applications from Himachal Pradesh University.

Basis of Admission

- Admission to PGDCA shall be made based on merit.

Eligibility Conditions

- Graduation in any discipline or equivalent from any University established by law in India with 50% marks (45% marks in case of Scheduled Caste/ Scheduled Tribe).
- Students appearing in the examination of the final year of the graduation course may also apply, provided they fulfil eligibility conditions at the time of counselling.

Age Limit

- The maximum age limit is 28 years on June 1, 2026, for general category candidates and 29 years for candidates belonging to the SC/ST category.

Admission Procedure

The application form, duly filled in along with the following documents, should be submitted online to the College Website .

- Short-listed candidates shall have to deposit the dues with in two days after getting their certificates verified and admission approved by the admission committee
- One attested copy of the Matriculation certificate as proof of date of birth.
- One attested copy of the 10+2 certificate.
- One attested copy of B.A./B.Sc./B.Com. Certificate, Aadhaar card, and Himachal Bonafide certificate.
- Certificate as proof of SC/ST status, Excellence in sports, Excellence in cultural activities, Physical Disability.
- Valid character-cum-college leaving certificate (issued by the Principal of the institution last attended for regular students or by a gazetted officer in case of private candidates) in original.
- The character certificate should have been issued within the last 6 months on the day of submission of the application.
- Migration certificate in original for those candidates who have graduated from a University other than H.P. University.

Fee Structure

Fee Rs. 14,000/- PTA Fund = 200/-, Library Security (refundable) = 500/-

- Migration fee of Rs. 400/- will be charged in case the student has passed the qualifying examination other than H.P. University.
- The above fee and funds are subject to change as per HPU/HP Govt. instructions.
- The fee will be paid in full at the time of admission. The fee, once deposited, shall not be refunded.



B.Sc. (Hons.) Biotechnology and B.Sc. (Hons.) Microbiology

No. of Seats

The total number of seats for each course is 25.

Basis of Admission

Admission will be based on the merit of 10+2 or equivalent examination.

Eligibility Conditions

- A. The admission to the B.Sc. with Major in Biotechnology/Microbiology Programme of Himachal Pradesh University will be as per the guidelines of Himachal Pradesh University, Shimla, from time to time.
- B. For admission in Biotechnology Hons, the candidate should have passed the 10+2 (class XII) Examination or its equivalent from a recognized Board/University with any of the four subjects out of Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics and Biology with 50% or equivalent grade (for SC/ST candidates, marks of eligibility will be 45% or equivalent grade).
- C. For Admission in Microbiology Hons, the candidate should have passed the 10+2 (class XII) Examination or its equivalent from a recognized Board/University with any of the three subjects out of Physics, Chemistry, and Biology or any other science subject with 50% or equivalent grade (for SC/ST candidates, marks of eligibility will be 45% or equivalent grade).
- D. In the case of candidates who are studying in a University /Board/College /School in any of the foreign countries, the eligibility/qualifying marks will be the same as recognized /equivalent to 10+2 by the university or Association of Indian Universities, with 50% marks or equivalent grade (for ST/SC candidates, eligibility will be 45% marks or equivalent grade).
- E. The candidate who has appeared in the qualifying examination but whose result has not yet been declared can also apply, but his/her eligibility for the entrance test will be purely provisional, subject to the condition that he/she has to produce a passing certificate scoring at least the minimum percentage of marks as prescribed for the qualifying examination on the specified day and time of counselling.

Age Limit

The candidate shall not be more than 22 years of age as on 1st June 2026.

Admission Procedure

Submission of application forms

Application form duly filled in, with the following documents enclosed, should be submitted online on the College Website on or before 20th June, 2026.

On the date of counselling, the following documents should be deposited duly attested.

- One attested photocopy of the Matriculation certificate as proof of date of birth.
- One attested photocopy of the 10+2 certificate.
- Three passport-size photographs.
- Valid character-cum-school leaving certificate (issued by the principal of the institution last attended for regular students or by a Gazetted Officer in case of private candidates) in original.
- The character certificate should have been issued within the last 6 months on the day of submission of the application.
- Migration certificate in original for those candidates who have done 10+2 from a School board other than the HP Board of School Education, Dharamshala.

Selection & Admission

- The list of short-listed candidates shall be displayed on the college website or the college notice board on 20th June 2026 at 4.00 p.m.
- Short-listed candidates shall have to deposit the dues between 21st June 2026 to 23rd June 2026 after getting their certificates verified and admission approved by the admission committee.

Eligibility Conditions for regularization of admission:

B.Sc. (Hons.) Biotechnology and B.Sc. (Hons.) Microbiology Second and Third Year

B.Sc. II - A candidate should have passed at least 50% of the papers of the First-year Examination.

B.Sc. III - A candidate should have passed at least 50% of the papers of the Second Year Examination and all the papers of the First Year Examination.

Eligibility conditions to appear in the annual examination

- 75% attendance is compulsory in theory and practical.
- 75% attendance is mandatory in seminars and the submission of assignments.
- It shall be mandatory for all students to appear in the House Examination. A minimum of 20% marks in each subject or 25% in aggregate shall be an essential condition to be eligible to appear in the annual examination.
- It shall also be mandatory to participate in the activities of subject societies.
- The University's annual examination form shall be treated as provisional unless and until the eligibility criteria as mentioned above for appearing in the annual examination are fulfilled by the candidate, and a certificate to this effect is given by the principal.
- (For determining the eligibility, 0.5% and above shall be considered as one percent.)

Rules of admission for outstanding sportswomen and outstanding students in cultural activities

- Admission against quota meant for outstanding sportswomen and outstanding students in cultural activities shall be made only once at the beginning of the session. These students must also qualify for the minimum eligibility conditions for admission in that course as provided under the rules.
- Original certificates will be verified at the time of admission.
- Only those students will be considered for the sports quota who have participated in the District/ State/ National level tournaments.
- Only those students who have secured 1st, 2nd, or 3rd position in the District/ State /National level in cultural events will be considered for the quota meant for outstanding students in cultural activities.
- It will be mandatory for these students to participate in sports/ cultural events.



MoU Signed between RKMV, Shimla and Orbit Biotech, Mohali

LIBRARY

RAJKIYA KANYA MAHAVIDYALAYA, SHIMLA

The institution has a fully automated library, equipped with internet facilities, catering to the academic needs of students through its two-fold services—reading room and book circulation. The library operates from 8:30 AM to 7:30 PM on all working days.

Automation is enabled through **SOUL 3.0 (ILMS)**, which ensures efficient management of cataloguing, circulation, and easy access to library resources. The library is also supported by a **Visitor Management System (VMS)** to digitally monitor and manage visitor entry, ensuring safety and transparency.

The library maintains a rich collection of textbooks, reference books, and regularly subscribes to about 10 daily newspapers, 22 magazines, and 06 specialized journals. In addition, the library provides access to four e-newspapers, enabling users to stay updated with current national and international developments in a digital format.

Students are encouraged to make full use of the library facilities during working hours. Furthermore, the library's association with the **ONOS (One Nation One Subscription)** initiative provides access to over 13,000 e-journals of national and international repute, ensuring seamless access to a wide range of academic resources.

The library also offers a 30-day internship programme for students of B.Lib. and M.Lib., providing practical exposure to modern library management systems.



1. Every student must carry the Library-cum-Identity Smart Card while visiting the library.
2. Books are issued for a maximum period of 14 days. A fine of Rs. 1/- per day will be charged for late returns.
3. No book will be reissued to the same student immediately after its return.
4. Loss of a book must be reported immediately. The borrower will be required to replace the book or pay its cost.
5. In case a book is defaced or damaged, it must be replaced by the borrower

IDENTITY CARDS

1. A student without a valid **identity cum-library smart card** will be treated as an outsider.
2. Students will not be allowed to enter the college premises without their identity card.
3. The identity cum-library smart card will be issued by the Librarian.
4. In case of loss, a duplicate card will be issued only with the permission of the Principal.

LEAVE RULES FOR STUDENTS

1. Request for leave, duly signed by parent or guardian on the prescribed application form (available in the college office) shall be entertained.
2. Leave of any kind does not exempt the student from depositing fees/fines on the scheduled date. Similarly, the student has to return the borrowed books on the due date.
3. Dean of the concerned faculty can sanction leave up to 10 days, while leave for more than 10 days will be sanctioned by the Principal.
4. Leave on account of illness, for more than 10 days, must be accompanied by a Medical Certificate/ Registration slip.
5. Students representing college in any activity/event will have to get their leave sanctioned from the Dean and get it noted (to the concerned subject teachers) before their departure.
6. Once leave is sanctioned a student is required to inform the concerned teacher.
7. Leave of any kind will not be permitted during the Mid Term examinations except for leave under unavoidable circumstances.

SPORTS

The college has facilities and offers coaching to players for participation in Inter-College and Inter-University Sports Championships; Basket Ball, Volley Ball, Badminton, Cricket, Kho-Kho, Athletics, Cross Country, Chess, Handball, Hockey etc. The college has a well-equipped fitness center to ensure physical fitness and stress free life.

COLLEGE MAGAZINE

The college bring out a yearly issue of its magazine "Padam" with unfailing regularity, publishing works of students, having a flair for writing.



The college offers hostel facilities for 200 students in Tribal and Sainik Hostels. The admission to the hostel is strictly based on merit, subject to the prescribed reservation/weightage policy. The vacant seats are allotted to new students every year and preference is given to first year students.

Eligibility Conditions

- Only those students will be eligible to seek admission to the hostels who have sought admission to the college before the admission date is over (without late fee).
- Seats in Tribal Hostel are reserved for tribal students only. Students from other categories are admitted in the Sainik Hostel. Seats are also reserved for SC, OBC, IRDP, physically challenged, wards of army personnel, ex-servicemen, outstanding sportspersons, students who have excelled in cultural activities and also for foreign students as per the rules of H.P. Govt.
- Admissions to the hostels are subject to approval of the hostel administration, on merit basis, subject to production of requisite documents and proof of identification.

Procedure for Hostel Admission

1. The students seeking admission are required to submit the Hostel Admission Form online on this website link: <https://rkmvshimla.edu.in/studentcorner/hosteladmission/>
2. **Hard copy with requisite documents is to be submitted, on the dates notified by the college authority.**
3. The submitted forms are scrutinized by the Hostel Management Committee and the list of eligible students is displayed on the notice board and the college website.
4. At the beginning of the session, all the vacant seats in the hostel will be allotted to the students on the basis of their merit and their respective category.
5. In case any seat falls vacant, it is allotted to the next student in the merit list prepared at the beginning of the session.
6. The student who seeks admission to the hostels is expected to participate in college activities.

Documents/Certificates/Undertakings required for Admission

The following certificates issued by the competent authority are required for admission to the hostel:

1. A medical fitness certificate issued by a Govt. medical officer or recognized hospital/clinic.
2. SC/ST (if applicable) certificate issued by a first class magistrate.
3. Handicapped certificate issued by the CMO (mentioning the percentage of disability)
4. National/State/District level participation/position certificate (sports or cultural) issued by a competent authority.
5. Widows and daughters of military personnel, killed in action, should produce Free Education Entitlement Card from the Ministry of Defence. Daughters of military personnel /ex- servicemen should produce Free Education Entitlement Card from a competent Military Authority.



6. An Undertaking by Parents, mentioning that her ward does not suffer from any physical or mental illness. If she develops any physical or mental illness/abnormality during her stay in the college hostel, which may cause hindrance in the daily routine of co-boarders, the college authorities reserve the right to cancel her room allotment in the hostel.
7. An undertaking by the parent mentioning that her ward will not indulge in any act that comes under the category of ragging.
8. Information regarding local guardian must be provided on a separate form along with a passport size photograph of the guardian, his/her specimen signature, duly verified by the parent.

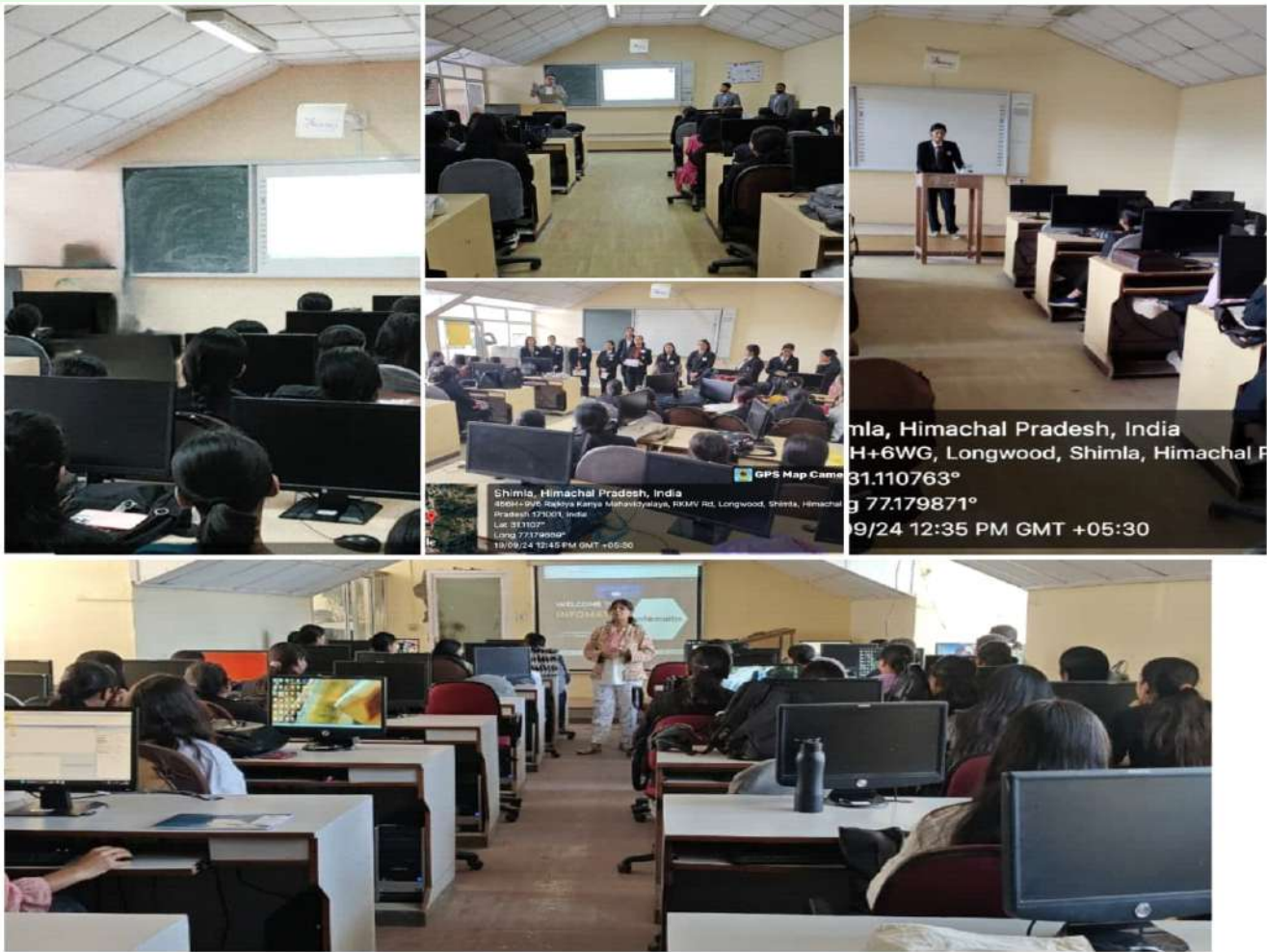

GREEN INITIATIVE

Additionally, biodegradable waste, from the campus, is converted into a nutrient rich compost, which is sold at reasonable rates generating revenue, a green gesture symbolizing growth and environmental care.

KATRAN

The project 'KATRAN', led by the Clothing and Textiles branch of the Department of Home Science focuses on upcycling pre-consumer fabric waste to promote sustainability and environmental awareness among students.
