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New Initiatives

GK Club Launched at RKMV

RKMV proudly launches the GK Club 2025, a vibrant initiative designed to strengthen students' general awareness, analytical skills, and intellectual confidence. 
Rangers Participate in Yuva Mitra–Apda Scheme

Educational/Field Visits

Educational Visit to the Geological Survey of India, Chandigarh

A group of students from Rajkiya Kanya Mahavidyalaya visited the Geological Survey of India (GSI), Chandigarh, on 8th October 2025 for an educational trip organized by the Department of Chemistry. Dr. Vikas Bhardwaj, Director, GSI gave an informative presentation on GSI's history, objectives, and contributions in geological mapping, mineral exploration, groundwater assessment, and environmental research. They observed rock and mineral specimens, fossils, and geological structures, and learned modern analytical techniques in the Chemistry Laboratory. The visit concluded with a trip to Chandigarh's Rock Garden, making it an educative and memorable experience.



Field Visit to Soil Testing Lab



The students of the Department of Chemistry accompanied by faculty members visited the Soil Testing Laboratory, Chaura Maidan on 14th November 2025 as part of their 'project-based learning' on soil analysis. The visit provided practical exposure to key soil testing procedures and their applications in agriculture. Ms. Sunita Dogra, Soil Testing Officer, briefed the students about the laboratory facilities, while researchers and officials explained the workflow of soil analysis, including sample preparation and assessment of parameters such as pH, organic carbon, nitrogen, phosphorus, potassium, and micronutrients. Students also observed instruments like pH meters, flame photometers and titration setups.

Anti-Drug Drives

Rise Above Addiction: Awareness Initiative

The NCC Unit of RKMV on 13th November 2025, organized an Anti-Drugs Awareness Program.
