A Brief Profile



Rajkiya Kanya Mahavidyalaya, Shimla (RKMV), a historical and premier institute of higher learning, was established when the erstwhile Raja Padam Chand Sanatan Dharm Bhargava Mahavidyalaya was taken over by the state government in 1977. The institute is duly accredited with B+ grade by UGC NAAC in the year 2023. The college is an educational landmark in the state of Himachal Pradesh which primarily aims at higher education of young women and offers undergraduate degree in Arts, Science, Commerce, Computers and Vocational courses.

Adding another feather in the cap, RKMV from the session 2024-25 got the approval of the Government to start Post Graduate classes in M.Com and MA in English, Political Science, Economics, Geography and History.

Since its inception in 1978 with the strength of 919 students, the college has been scaling great heights with student strength rising to more than three thousand. The job oriented self-finance courses especially BCA, B.Sc. CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM (CBCS)

From the academic session 2016-17, H.P. University adopted the UGC framework of curriculum under CBCS to ensure uniformity in the standards of higher education and to provide the students with quality education at par with the best in India. The CBCS provides an opportunity for the students to choose subjects from the prescribed courses comprising Core, Elective and Skill. In this system the courses are evaluated following a grading system. The uniform grading system will benefit the students to move across institutions both within and outside India. A candidate shall have to undergo the prescribed courses of study in a period not less than 3 years and not more than 5 years from the date of admission. Outline

As per the recommendations of the committee constituted by the government, it was decided that the Semester system in UG classes be changed to **Annual System** from the Academic Session 2018-19.

The UG programme (3 year degree course) under CBCS in a college affiliated to H.P. University will comprise of the following categories of courses:

1. **Core Course (CC):** A course, which is compulsorily studied by a candidate as a core requirement.
2. **Discipline Specific Course (DSC):** A course which is chosen from a pool of courses, which are specific/specialised/supportive to the discipline/subject of study, or which provides an extended scope or nurtures the candidate's proficiency/skill.
 - **Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) Course:** Elective courses offered under the main discipline/subject of study are Discipline Specific Elective Courses.
3. **Generic Elective (GE) Course:** An elective course chosen from an unrelated discipline/subject with an intention to seek exposure beyond the discipline/s of choice. GE opted would be other than the two DSCs already offered.
4. **Ability Enhancement Courses:** These are of two kinds: Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC) and Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC).
 - **Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC):** Are the courses based upon the content that leads to knowledge enhancement. These are mandatory for all disciplines. Courses to be studied under this are - Environmental Science and English Communication/Modern Indian Languages (MIL).
 - **Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC):** Value-based or skill-based courses, aimed at providing hands-on training designed to enhance competencies and skills of students.

CREDIT DETERMINATION

A student has to earn **132 credits** for pass course degree in B.A./B.Sc./B.Com. Programme.

An undergraduate degree in **Humanities/Commerce** discipline is awarded if a student completes:

- 4 (DSC) Core papers each in two core courses of choice.
- 2 Core papers each in English and MIL respectively (compulsory for all).
- 2 Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC) (compulsory for all).
- 4 Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC).
- 2 (DSE) papers each in two selected courses of choice (Discipline Specific Elective).
- 2 papers from the list of Generic Elective (GE) papers.

An undergraduate degree in **Science** discipline is awarded if a student completes:

- 4 (DSC) Core papers each in **three** disciplines of choice.
- 2 Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC).
- 4 Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC).
- 2 Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) courses each, in three disciplines of choice.

EVALUATION SYSTEM CREDITS

The term 'credit' refers to the weightage given to a course, usually in terms of the number of instructional hours assigned per week. This explains why 'credit' is usually taken to mean 'credit hours'. For the purpose of credit determination, the instructional hours are divided into 3 components:

LECTURES (L) Class room lectures of one-hour duration.

TUTORIALS (T) Special, elaborate instructions on specific topics (from lecture) of one-hour duration

PRACTICALS (P) Laboratory or field exercises of two-hour duration.

Each one of these components is considered equal to one credit. One lecture (L) or one tutorial (T) of one hour a week is considered as one credit, whereas one practical (P) of two hours a week is considered as one credit. The total weightage given to a course in terms of credits will be equal to L+T+P. This can be written in symbols as:

$C = L+T+P$ (where C is the credit weightage for a particular course)

MARKING / ASSESSMENT SCHEME

As per H.P. University guidelines, the marking scheme for all undergraduate courses in the annual system for **B.Com./ B.A.** programme (with exception of some practical subjects) will be in the ratio of 70:30 i.e., 70 marks for theory (annual examination) and 30 marks for Continuous Comprehensive Assessment (CCA). For all the courses of **B.Sc.** Programme, the ratio will be 50:20:30 i.e., 50 marks for theory (annual examination), 20 marks for practical (annual examination) and 30 marks for CCA respectively.

CONTINUOUS COMPREHENSIVE ASSESSMENT (CCA)

The 30 marks under CCA will be determined by the concerned teacher on the basis of the following components:

1. Mid-Term Test = 10 marks (BA/B.Com/B.Sc.) (15 marks in case of Mathematics, Chemistry, Computer Science)
2. Class Test = 5 marks (BA/B.Com/B.Sc. Physics, Zoology, Botany)
3. Assignments/Seminars = 10 marks
4. Classroom Attendance = 5 marks

Classroom attendance will be defined as follows:

- >75% but <80% = 1 mark.
- >80% but <85% = 2 marks
- >85% but <90% = 3 marks
- >90% but <95% = 4 marks
- >95% = 5 marks

MID-TERM AND CLASS TESTS

Mid-Term Test, which is mandatory for every student to take, will be conducted in each course during the academic year. Mid-Term test will be conducted on completion of 75% of the syllabus.

Class test will be conducted on completion of 40% of the syllabus.

Note: As per the University guidelines, the student who does not score 35% marks in CCA and fails to have minimum 75% class room attendance will not be allowed to appear in the annual examination.

Note:

- A candidate will have to list 4 subjects/courses of her choice for DSC-1, which will be allotted to the candidate, purely **on the basis of merit**. Subjects of DSC-1 and DSC-2 will be from different groups.
- Choice of subjects/courses by a candidate does not guarantee admission to a particular course.
- A candidate cannot opt for 2 practical subjects as DSC-1 and DSC-2.

GUIDELINES AND CONDITIONS FOR OBTAINING DEGREE

- A student has to earn 132 credits for a pass course degree in B.A./B.Sc./B.Com. Programme.
- Every student shall be required to undergo a regular course of study i.e. minimum 75% attendance in each of the concerned courses in Theory and Practicals, tutorials, seminars etc. in order to be eligible to appear for University examination.
- Internal Assessment/Continuous Comprehensive Assessment (CCA) and Annual Examination will be as per HPU guidelines.
- In Annual System under CBCS, 40% marks in aggregate (Internal Assessment + Final Exams) are the minimum qualifying marks. However, it is compulsory to score minimum 35% marks in CCA and Final Examination separately. For practicals, minimum 40% passing marks are mandatory.
- A student failing either one or two papers in the annual examination will be placed under compartment in those papers. Such students will have only two chances, one at supplementary stage and another at the annual stage, to clear the compartment.
- A student failing in three or more papers will be treated as failed and will have to repeat the class.
- The results will be declared as per grading system and the students will have to complete the degree within 5 years of admission.

Note: The above guidelines may vary as per the latest notification issued by H.P. University.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA FOR ADMISSION

- 1. B.A. Pass Course:** Provided that the student who has passed +2 examination or an examination equivalent thereto, accepted as equivalent by various bodies of H.P. University with 33% marks (including English). The students opting for Mathematics as one of the subjects of study must have 45% marks in aggregate or 45% marks in Mathematics at +2 level. However, a student who has passed qualifying examination in Arts stream will be given preference in B.A. programme.
- 2. B.Sc. Pass Course:** Provided that the student who has passed +2 examination or an examination equivalent thereto, accepted as equivalent by various bodies of H.P. University with pass marks in five subjects (three Science subjects, English & one optional) with 45% marks. The students seeking admission in B.Sc. 1st year (Non- Medical) have the option to choose either Chemistry or Computer Science as one of the Discipline Specific Courses for study.
- 3. B.Com. Pass Course:** The minimum eligibility condition for a student to get admission in B.Com. is 33% marks at +2 level. However, a student who has passed the qualifying examination in Commerce stream will be given preference in the Commerce programme. The candidates opting for Commerce from other streams must have passed Mathematics/Economics as compulsory subjects at +2 level with a minimum of 45% marks in respective subject/s and 40% in aggregate.
4. A student who has passed Shastri, Prak Shastri from a Sanskrit College affiliated to H.P. University or Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan (Deemed University) under MHRD, Govt. of India, shall be eligible for admission to Arts stream only, provided the candidate has passed Prak Shastri or Shastri with English as one of the subjects.
5. Vocational subjects under National Vocational Education Qualification Framework (NVEQF) shall be given weightage equivalent to any other general education subject.
6. All the admissions in B.A./B.Sc./B.Com. programme will be made on the merit of +2 examination, taking into consideration the best five subjects including English as one of the subjects.
- 7. The students placed under compartment or failed in +2 examination are not eligible for admission to the college.**
8. Admission against quota meant for outstanding students in sports and cultural activities, shall be made only once in the beginning of the session. These students must also qualify the minimum eligibility conditions for admission in that course as provided under rules.
9. Only those students will be considered for Sports quota who have participated in international/ National/ State/District Level Tournaments (or secured positions).
10. Only those students who have participated in cultural events at National/State/District Level will be considered for the quota meant for outstanding students in cultural activities.
11. It will be mandatory for the students admitted against Sports and Cultural quotas to participate in sports/cultural events.

Age Criteria (Upper Age Limit)

- An applicant must not be more than 23 years of age (25 years in case of girl students) as on July 1, 2025. A relaxation of 3 years is applicable to candidates belonging to SC/ST category.
- The Vice-Chancellor, HPU may, in exceptional cases/circumstances, to be recorded in writing, give relaxation in age up to a maximum of 6 months to any candidate. All such cases of age relaxation of up to six months may be granted admission provisionally by the Principal and a consolidated list of all such cases will be sent for approval to the Vice-Chancellor by 31st October of every academic year.
- Relaxation in upper age limit is admissible to physically challenged candidates also.

Note:

- **All admissions made by the college are provisional till regularized by H.P. University.**
- **University ordinance shall be strictly adhered to for admission to all classes.**

RESERVATION OF SEATS FOR ADMISSION (ORDINANCE 3.14)

The college follows the reservation policy of H. P. Government adopted by H. P. University in admissions. The following reservations are in accordance with the reservation roster of H. P. University:

Scheduled Caste (SC)	15%
Scheduled Tribe (ST)	7.5%

ADMISSION PROCEDURE (B.A./B.Sc./B.Com. 1st Year)

Guidelines and General Instructions:

- The candidates seeking admission to the above courses should apply **online**. Also, all the documents must be produced in original, at the time of counseling. The admission form, complete in all respect, is to be filled by the candidate and copies of the requisite documents should be uploaded through the college website i.e. www.rkmvshimla.edu.in.
- A student applying for admission to B.A. 1st year will give preference of four subjects/courses of choice. Please refer to [page 11](#). The allotment of courses (DSC-1 & DSC-2) will be purely on merit basis.
- Subject wise merit list will be displayed on the college notice board and the college website on the dates notified by the University.
- The admission form recommended by the Admission Committee and approved by the Principal entitles a student to deposit the prescribed fee within the stipulated period.
- A candidate who fails to deposit the fee/dues by the scheduled date and time shall forfeit her right to admission and the seat shall be offered to the next student in the merit list for which the notices will be displayed on the notice board and official website, accordingly.
- In case of a tie, the candidate older in age shall be given weightage.
- **Incomplete admission forms** and those without hard copies (at the time of counseling) of uploaded documents will not be entertained.
- No admission, whatsoever, shall be made after the due date.
- All admissions will be as per admission schedule notified by H.P. University from time to time.

Documents and Certificates to be Uploaded

- Passport size photograph.
- Copy of **Matriculation** certificate.
- Copy of **10+2** certificate.
- Copy of **Original Character Certificate** from the Head of the Institution last attended or character certificate issued by a Gazetted Officer in case of a private candidate. The character certificate should not have been issued more than 6 months prior to the date of admission.
- Copy of certificate issued by competent authority for availing benefit of **reservation** in the category concerned.
- Copy of **Bonafide Himachali Certificate** for the exemption of Tuition Fee.
- A documentary evidence/declaration as the proof of activities for the **period of gap** in the academic career. A maximum gap of two years is permissible.
- An **Equivalence Eligibility Certificate** from H.P. Board/University for the candidates who have passed +2 from a Board other than H.P. Board of School Education/ I.C.S.E./C.B.S.E.
- Copy of **original Migration certificate** for the candidates who have passed from Board/University other than the H.P. Board of School Education /H.P. University.
- Copy of **Aadhaar** card.

Note:

- **Admission without any of the above-mentioned documents shall be purely provisional and at the candidate's own risk.**
- **The candidate must produce all her original certificates for verification when demanded by the Admission Committee/College Office** as and when notified.

Students must furnish the college with their **latest** Aadhaar ID, Email ID and Mobile Number.

ADMISSIONS AND COURSE GUIDELINES FOR B.A./B.Sc./ B.Com. 2nd & 3rd YEAR

- Admission to the above classes shall be open on **Roll-on** basis as per the date/s notified by the University. Under Roll-on system, the student who has taken the examination of 1st and 2nd year in the previous session is allowed to take **provisional** admission in the next class i.e. in 2nd and 3rd year respectively, without waiting for the final result.
- Roll-on provisional admission to the next class will be regularised only if the student is declared pass (or placed under compartment).
- However, these students will have to fulfill all the formalities of admission laid down by the college authorities within the stipulated date and time.
- **DSC-1 and DSC-2, once chosen/allotted in first year, cannot be changed in 2nd or 3rd year.**
- The students getting admission in 2nd year will have to study two Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC- 1 & SEC-2) of DSC-1 in addition to DSC-1 and DSC-2, Compulsory English/MIL in B.A./B.Com. and DSC-1, DSC-2, DSC-3 in B.Sc.
- The students seeking admission in B.A./B.Com. 3rd year will have to study the Discipline Specific Elective (DSE-1, DSE-2) courses in the subjects/disciplines (DSC) studied earlier, SEC-3 and SEC-4 in the subject of their first choice and two courses of Generic Elective (GE-1 & GE-2) of an unrelated subject/discipline, other than DSE-1 & DSE-2.
- The students of B.Sc. 3rd year will have to study the DSE-1, DSE-2, DSE-3 in the subjects/disciplines selected earlier and SEC-3, SEC-4 in the subject of their first choice studied.

Note: All the candidates are directed to strictly adhere to the timeline prescribed by the H.P. University.

Fines and Penalties

1. In case a student does not deposit her dues on the dates notified, her name will be struck off from the College rolls at the end of the month.
2. The name of a student will also be struck off from the college rolls if she remains absent without sanctioned leave, continuously for 10 lectures or more.
3. The student must be accompanied by her parent or guardian at the time of re-admission.
4. Once the name is struck off, the student must seek re-admission within seven days.
5. In case a student wants to leave the College, she will have to procure a 'no-dues certificate' from the College/ Library/ Concerned Department/NSS /Sports/ College Canteen/Fee Clerk etc.

LIBRARY

A semi-automated library, equipped with internet facility, caters to the need of the students through its two-fold service- the reading room and issuance of books. It operates from 9:00 AM to 7:00 PM on all working days. The library maintains a good collection of text books, reference books and regularly subscribes to as many as 20 daily newspapers, 22 magazines and specialized journals. Students are encouraged to avail library facilities during operating hours. Additionally, the library's association with **ONOS** (One Nation One Subscription) project grants members access to over 13000 plus e-journals of national and international importance. The initiative ensures seamless access to a wide range of academic resources.



Library Rules

1. The student must carry her Library-Cum-Identity Card every time to the library.
2. Books will be issued for a maximum period of 14 days. Late return of book/s will incur a fine of Rs. 1/- per day
3. No book will be reissued to the same student immediately after its return.
4. Loss of book must be reported immediately. The borrower will be required to replace the book or pay the cost of the book.
5. In case a book is defaced or damaged, in anyway, the book has to be replaced by the borrower.
6. No dues certificate shall be issued only after all the issued books are returned to the library.
7. Complete silence must be maintained in the library.

The Library also provides an **internship programme** for a period of 30 days to the students of B.Lib. and M.Lib.

IDENTITY CARD

- **Student without an identity card (duly signed by the Principal) is deemed as an outsider.**
 - Student will not be allowed to enter the college premises without the identity card.
 - A student is not permitted to replace/tear her photograph on the identity card.
- Library-cum-Identity Card shall be issued by the Librarian. In case of its loss, a duplicate card will be issued only with the permission of the Principal.

LEAVE RULES FOR STUDENTS

1. Request for leave, duly signed by parent or guardian on the prescribed application form (available in the college office) shall be entertained.
2. Leave of any kind does not exempt the student from depositing fees/fines on the scheduled date. Similarly, the student has to return the borrowed books on the due date.
3. Dean of the concerned faculty can sanction leave up to 10 days, while leave for more than 10 days will be sanctioned by the Principal.
4. Leave on account of illness, for more than 10 days, must be accompanied by a Medical Certificate/Registration slip.
5. Students representing college in any activity/event will have to get their leave sanctioned from the Dean and get it noted (to the concerned subject teachers) before their departure.
6. Once leave is sanctioned a student is required to inform the concerned teacher.
7. Leave of any kind will not be permitted during the Mid Term examinations except for leave under unavoidable circumstances.

SPORTS

The college has facilities and offers coaching to players for participation in Inter-College and Inter-University Sports Championships: Basket Ball, Volley Ball, Badminton, Cricket, Kho-Kho, Athletics, Cross Country, Chess, Handball, Hockey etc. The college has a well- equipped fitness center to ensure physical fitness and stress free life.

COLLEGE MAGAZINE

The college brings out an yearly issue of its magazine “*Padam*” with unfailing regularity, publishing works of students, having a flair for writing.

BACHELOR OF VOCATION (B.Voc.)

About the Course

The Bachelor of Vocation (B.Voc.) is a 3-year, skill-based undergraduate programme (divided into 6 semesters) recognized at par with other bachelor programs like BA, B.Sc, and B.Com. B.Voc. lays emphasis on developing practical skills alongside academic learning. This program goes beyond classroom teaching, as it grooms students in professional skills, and provides exposure of industry through guest lectures and real-world insights from Industry Visits and Internships/ On the Job Training.

With 40% theory and 60% practical exposure, the course prepares students for immediate employment, facilitating their easy absorption in the industry and also empowering them for self-employment.

The college offers two NSQF-approved, UGC-recognized degree programs:

- **B.Voc. in Retail Management** – 40 Seats
- **B.Voc. in Hospitality & Tourism** – 40 Seats

Both programs offer assistance in campus placement with an average salary package ranging from ₹ 15,000- ₹35,000.

ADMISSIONS

The eligibility criteria for admission shall be as per the University guidelines, issued from time to time. A maximum of 40 students can be admitted to B.Voc. programme in the first semester. No student shall be admitted directly to third or fifth semester.

Eligibility Conditions

- The candidate must have completed 10+2 (from HP board, CBSE, ICSE board, or any equivalent board) in any stream. Equal weightage will be given to students with vocational subjects at +2 level.
- There is no age bar for admission to this course.
- **The candidates who have acquired Vocational Certificate/Diploma or Advanced Diploma from UGC recognized Community Colleges/B.Voc institutions or DDU Kaushal Kendras in a specific sector with certified skills on a particular job role will be eligible for admission through lateral entry to next higher level on same sector.**
- Candidates with the following qualification can be given admission to the first semester of skill-based courses under NSQF

Category 1: Students who have already acquired NSQF certification level 4 in a particular industry sector may opt for admission in the skill-based courses under NSQF.

Category 2: Students who have acquired NSQF certification level 4 and would like to change their trade, may enter into skill based courses in a different trade.

Category 3: Students who have passed 10+2 examinations in conventional schooling without any background of vocational training.

NOTE: Preferred subjects and index mark calculations will be decided by the respective Board of Studies.

RESERVATION OF SEATS:

The reservation of seats shall be as per Himachal Pradesh Government Notification issued from time to time and as per the rules of the Himachal Pradesh University, Shimla.

GENERAL GUIDELINES

- A candidate cannot pursue two full time Under-Graduate courses simultaneously.
- University reserves the right to cancel an admission at any stage.
- The applicants seeking re-entry into the education and training for further advanced learning in their field of expertise in a particular trade shall get preference in admission over the new applicants.
- In case of any matter relating to the Under-Graduate admissions, the decision of the Admission Committee/Vice-Chancellor of Himachal Pradesh University, Shimla shall be final.

NOTE: All legal matters pertaining to the Under-Graduate admissions shall be subject to the Himachal Pradesh Jurisdiction only.



HOSTEL

The college offers hostel facilities for 200 students in Tribal and Sainik Hostels. The admission to the hostel is strictly based on merit, subject to the prescribed reservation/weightage policy. The vacant seats are allotted to new students every year and preference is given to first year students.

Eligibility Conditions

- Only those students will be eligible to seek admission to the hostels who have sought admission to the college before the admission date is over (without late fee).
- Seats in Tribal Hostel are reserved for tribal students only. Students from other categories are admitted in the Sainik Hostel. Seats are also reserved for SC, OBC, IRDP, physically challenged, wards of army personnel, ex-servicemen, outstanding sports persons, students who have excelled in cultural activities and also for foreign students as per the rules of H.P. Govt.
- Admissions to the hostels are subject to approval of the hostel administration, on merit basis, subject to production of requisite documents and proof of identification.

Procedure for Hostel Admission

1. The students seeking admission are required to submit the Hostel Admission Form online on this website link:
<https://rkmvshimla.edu.in/studentscorner/hosteladmission/>
2. Hard copy with requisite documents is to be submitted, on the dates notified by the college authority.
3. The submitted forms are scrutinized by the Hostel Management Committee and the list of eligible students is displayed on the notice board and the college website.
4. At the beginning of the session, all the vacant seats in the hostel will be allotted to the students on the basis of their merit and their respective category.
5. In case any seat falls vacant, it is allotted to the next student in the merit list prepared at the beginning of the session.
6. The student who seeks admission to the hostels is expected to participate in college activities.

Documents/Certificates/Undertakings required for Admission

The following certificates issued by the competent authority are required for admission to the hostel:

1. A medical fitness certificate issued by a Govt. medical officer or recognized hospital/clinic.
2. SC/ST (if applicable) certificate issued by a first class magistrate.
3. Handicapped certificate issued by the CMO (mentioning the percentage of disability)
4. National/State/District level participation/position certificate (sports or cultural) issued by a competent authority.
5. Widows and daughters of military personnel, killed in action, should produce Free Education Entitlement Card from the Ministry of Defence. Daughters of military personnel /ex- servicemen should produce Free Education Entitlement Card from a competent Military Authority.
6. An Undertaking by Parents, mentioning that her ward does not suffer from any physical or mental illness. If she develops any physical or mental illness/abnormality during her stay in the college hostel, which may cause hindrance in the daily routine of co-boarders, the college authorities reserve the right to cancel her room allotment in the hostel.
7. An undertaking by the parent mentioning that her ward will not indulge in any act that comes under the category of ragging.
8. Information regarding local guardian must be provided on a separate form along with a passport size photograph of the guardian, his/her specimen signature, duly verified by the parent.

Hostel Fees and Funds

VALUE ADDED/ ADD-ON PROGRAMMES

Value Added/Add-on programmes are extra courses that help students acquire more skills and gain knowledge. The programme will help students to connect the knowledge acquired in real life situations, making them more job-ready. These are teacher-assisted learning courses (taught by internal and guest faculty teachers) open to all students. The number of seats may vary from 20-40, depending upon the course.

These courses are conducted after class hours and students can register only in one course at a time in each academic year. The duration of each course is of 30 hours and the fee per course will be ₹ 200/-

CELLS AND CLUBS

NATIONAL CADET CORPS (NCC)

NCC forms an integral part of RKMV, comprising of two units (80 students per unit). Students of Ist Year can join NCC by filling an enrollment form available in the college's NCC Office. During their training, spanning over two years, students can obtain B and C certificates. They are also given a chance to learn and enjoy mountaineering, rock-climbing, trekking, rafting etc.

NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME (NSS)

National Service Scheme volunteers with the motto, “Not me, but you”, work tirelessly towards social welfare activities, awareness and national integration programs, and make sincere efforts to motivate people to be selfless in their service.

THE BHARAT SCOUTS AND GUIDES

Activities undertaken by Bharat Scouts and Guides are primarily based on community development. The college has two units of about 40 students.

CAREER COUNSELLING, TRAINING AND PLACEMENT CELL

The Cell guides the students regarding different career prospects that are available for them. Resource persons from government and private agencies are invited by the cell to counsel the students. DISASTER MANAGEMENT CELL

The cell, with the help of police personnel and home guards, makes sincere efforts to educate and train volunteers and the general students to work with equanimity of mind, in the event of any natural or man-made disaster.

RED RIBBON CLUB

The Red Ribbon Club educates and sensitizes the youth to take a lead in reaching out to the general public by launching exhaustive campaigns against AIDS. Students can get themselves registered as volunteers of this club and carry out the awareness activities/campaigns in the society.

ROAD SAFETY CLUB

The Club familiarizes and raises awareness regarding road safety among students. Students are also involved in drives/campaigns related to road safety.

ELECTORAL LITERACY CLUB

The Club engages the students in activities and hands-on experience to sensitize them regarding their electoral rights. It familiarizes them with the electoral process of registration and voting. The Club has been strengthening the culture of electoral participation amongst youth and future voters.

ECO CLUB

An active and vibrant Eco-Club is functioning in the college for creating awareness on various ecological issues and is tirelessly working for the improvement of natural environment.

ENERGY CLUB

The Club in collaboration with Himachal Pradesh State Electricity Board (HPSEB) has been created in the college with the intent of educating students, regarding the prudent use of energy and to spread awareness regarding various schemes of HPSEB. RKMV is the only college in Shimla Division to be chosen for this honor.

INFRASTRUCTURE AND LEARNING FACILITIES

SCIENCE LABS

The College has well equipped Chemistry, Botany, Physics, Zoology, Biotechnology, Microbiology labs which are upgraded from time to time, keeping in view the latest technological demands for the benefit of the students.

INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY (IT) LAB

A well-equipped Information Technology lab, with internet facility, to impart ICT education to the students of all streams.

HOSPITALITY AND TOURISM LAB

In this lab, students are taught communication and personality development skills required in the hospitality industry through role plays, group discussions, case studies, presentations, and mini projects. The students are also made aware about the current trends and practices in Tourism and Hospitality Industry.

PSYCHOLOGY LABORATORY

A dedicated space designed to support experimental learning, testing, research and skill development across various branches of psychology. It is equipped with standardized apparatuses and psychological tests.

HOME SCIENCE LABORATORY

The Home Science laboratory is well-equipped with modern facilities and appliances to support practical sessions and demonstrations. It provides students with hands-on experience in culinary arts and nutrition-related experiments. Further, the Apparel and Designing Laboratory is well furnished with essential tools and equipment to allow students to explore various aspects of apparel designing, pattern making, and garment construction.

LANGUAGE LAB

The laboratory equipped with 34 computers help to acquire proficiency in listening, speaking, reading and writing languages. The digital language lab offers a strong platform to the students for honing their skills and competency in English, Hindi and Sanskrit language, in an interactive manner.

PAINTING STUDIO

The studio through practical training in portraiture, painting (still life, life study etc.), and mixed media provides students with a dynamic and immersive environment to cultivate their artistic skills and creative vision. The studio-based learning and hands-on training is complemented with theoretical study in art history, encompassing both Indian and Western artists. Students explore key movements, artists, materials, and techniques, gaining a deeper understanding of the historical and cultural context of their work, enabling a comprehensive approach in the visual arts.

APPLIED ART STUDIO

The Studio provides a creative space to artists and designers where they can solve problems through innovative and creative solutions. The students advance by honing their creative expertise to solve complex problems and with the application of skills in Graphic Designing (especially for visual communication and appeal), Industrial Designing, Fashion Designing, Digital Media etc. The Studio works closely with clients to ensure that the design meet specific client's needs and goals.

OUTREACH AND EXTENSION ACTIVITIES: A STEP TOWARDS SUSTAINABILITY



ROTI BANK

To inculcate values of selfless social service among students, the college has started the Roti Bank initiative under 'share and care'. The bank teaches them the virtues of generosity and philanthropy so that they evolve into true citizens of the nation and uphold Mahatma Gandhi's philosophy of adhering to a minimalistic lifestyle.

CAMPUS WASTE MANAGEMENT

RKMV is working in the direction of waste management initiatives which focuses on waste segregation, sending plastic waste for recycling, and making compost out of biodegradable waste. The project plays a crucial role in organizing workshops and guest lectures on waste management, provide training on chemical free cleaners and home cleaning products.

Waste to Wealth: This initiative tackles single-use plastic pollution by collecting plastic waste and handing it over to the Municipal Corporation of Shimla at ₹75/kg for proper disposal.

MILK BAG RECYCLING PROJECT

The project promotes environmental awareness and sustainable practices amongst students, faculty and staff. The initiative facilitates the collection, recycling and re-purposing of plastic milk bags and single use plastic to reduce carbon footprints. The project symbolizes a commitment to environmental stewardship, sustainable development and community engagement.

GREEN INITIATIVE

RKMV with the help of active student participation and the **Department of Environmental Science**, maintains a thriving plant nursery which not only fosters a green ethos but also encourages a sense of responsibility towards nature. RKMV upholds the tradition of gifting potted plants to guests, symbolizing growth, sustainability and its commitment to environmental stewardship. Additionally, biodegradable waste, from the campus, is converted into a nutrient rich compost, which is sold at reasonable rates generating revenue, a green gesture symbolizing growth and environmental care.

KATRAN

The project 'KATRAN', led by the Clothing and Textiles branch of the **Department of Home Science** focuses on upcycling pre-consumer fabric waste to promote sustainability and environmental awareness among students. Students are trained in designing and producing usable textile products, such as eco-friendly jute potli. The project supports the idea of 'earn while you learn,' combining creativity, skill-building, and environmental consciousness with students' income generation. By keeping textiles in use for longer duration and reducing dependency on virgin materials, Project KATRAN contributes to the circular economy and sets a meaningful example of innovation and responsibility in the fashion and textile sector.

Expanding opportunities for artistic growth, **the Department of Painting** facilitates students to create custom artwork for hotels and other establishments on commission basis. The department marked a significant achievement in mural and relief sculpture project at H.P Secretariat. MoU of RKMV with Mahsu Art Society, Shimla, a nonprofit organization, provides students the chance to participate in national and international exhibitions and workshops in various cities enhancing their exposure, networks, overall artistic development and a chance to earn while they learn.
