1. Mode of Teaching at RKMV

1.1 Lecture Method:


At RKMV, teaching–learning practices are designed to ensure academic rigor, student engagement, and holistic development through a judicious blend of traditional and modern pedagogical approaches. The **lecture method** remains a core mode of instruction, enabling systematic coverage of the syllabus and clear explanation of fundamental concepts. Faculty members enrich lectures with discussions, examples, and question–answer sessions to promote conceptual clarity and critical thinking.



1.2 Technology-based teaching:

To complement conventional teaching, **ICT-based teaching** is widely adopted. Smart classrooms, PowerPoint presentations, audio-visual aids, e-resources, and **online learning platforms** are effectively used to enhance understanding and make learning more interactive and student-centric. Digital tools facilitate access to updated knowledge and promote self-directed learning.


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
Blended Teaching:

Furthermore, **blended teaching** integrates face-to-face instruction with online learning resources. This approach provides flexibility, accommodates diverse learning styles, and ensures continuity of learning beyond the classroom. Overall, the multi-modal teaching practices at RKMV aim to create an inclusive, engaging, and outcome-oriented learning environment.

1.3 Flipped Class Room:

RKMV also encourages innovative strategies such as the **flipped classroom**, wherein students are introduced to topics in advance through reading materials, videos, or online resources. Classroom time is then utilized for discussions, problem-solving, and application-based activities, thereby fostering active learning and deeper comprehension.


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In addition to this, RKMV adopts a systematic approach to assess the diverse learning levels of students at the entry level and during the course of study. After admission, an **induction meeting** for all freshers is conducted in which the students are properly counselled. Thereafter, **primary assessment** of the students is done based on their previous academic record followed by **classroom discussions, class tests, and question-and-answer sessions**. Each student's performance is closely monitored. Once the learning capacities, the strengths and weaknesses of the students are identified, the college takes appropriate measures for improvements in the performance of the students.

For academically slow learners, teachers engage in one-to-one interaction during their contact hours to enable weaker students to overcome their inhibitions and learning gaps. Also, apart from classroom and tutorials, innovative pedagogy like **flipped classroom approach** is adopted. In addition **remedial**


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classes, **mentorship programs** and **doubt clearing sessions** are held regularly to improve the understanding level of the students. The remedial classes emphasize discussing the content that the students find difficult. The slow learners are provided with extra study material after the lessons for better understanding.



For advanced learners' enrichment opportunities such as participation in seminars, research projects, certificate courses (e.g., **SWAYAM**), **value-added courses**, add-on courses and competitive exam preparation are offered. Apart from that, **Star batches**, scholarships and summer school trainings are also conducted for these students to provide them additional knowledge. The institution ensures that both categories of learners receive adequate attention and resources to enhance their academic journey. Continuous monitoring and feedback mechanisms are employed to track progress and address individual needs effectively, thereby promoting an inclusive and learner-centric academic environment.
