



## Minutes of the Meeting held on 2<sup>nd</sup> December 24


## Minutes of the Meeting







- A one week FDP will be organised for the mental well being of the teaching and the non-teaching staff.





## A Meeting Regarding Forthcoming FDP on 'Wellness'

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) convened a meeting on 3rd April 2025 to discuss the formulation and implementation of a Faculty Development Programme (FDP) on 'Wellness.' The FDP is envisioned to endorse Indian Knowledge System's (IKS) stance on sustainable living, ethical behaviour, spiritual growth, mindfulness, connection with nature, healthy habits, meditation, positive thinking, and questioning our fixed notions. With reference to the meeting held on 6th March 2025, the following key points were discussed and decisions taken:

A detailed draft for the proposed FDP on Wellness was discussed as the program aims to address physical, mental, and emotional well-being among students and faculty members. It was decided that experts from wellness and healthcare field, Ms. Preeti Mann and Mr Saurabh Mittal, alumni of Oxford, IIT and SRCC would be invited as Resource Persons. They are running their Wellness Centre in Panchrukhi, Himachal Pradesh and also work as trainers for Chief Experienced Officers (CXO).

It was unanimously decided to include students along with teaching and non-teaching staff in the Wellness Program for a 3-day period. Activities focusing on student wellness, mindfulness, stress management, and lifestyle practices will be tailored to their needs. Specific days will be reserved exclusively for student participation.

A one week interactive module with activities, talks, and practical sessions will be designed by IQAC in consultation with the resource persons. It was also decided that the sessions would be designed in such a manner that minimum academic disruption takes place. Responsibilities were assigned to various IQAC members for finalizing the FDP structure, contacting experts, venue arrangements, and communication logistics.

The meeting concluded with a positive outlook towards the holistic impact of the FDP on the institutional community.

## Proceedings of the Meeting held on 11th April 2025

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) convened a follow-up meeting with the staff members under the chairmanship of the Principal Dr Anurita Saxena. The implementation and outcomes of the proposed Faculty Development Programme (FDP) on Wellness were taken up, as per the previous meeting's resolutions. This FDP was in validation of the interconnectedness of beings and sustainable lifestyle as put forth by the Indian Knowledge System (IKS). The following points were discussed in the meeting:

The committee apprised that the FDP on Wellness will be conducted over a period of one week where thirty teachers, and non-teaching staff members as well as thirty students will be given a chance to participate only on 'first come first serve basis.' The last three days would be reserved for students whereas the teaching, and non-teaching staff would be allowed to sit with them for half a day and the remaining sessions of the teachers would be conducted in the Dance room. The programme will feature expert-led sessions by Ms. Preeti Mann and Mr Saurabh Mittal which will focus on physical fitness, mental health awareness, and stress management.

The registration form and the brochure were shared with the staff and the work of documenting and compiling the record of the FDP activities were assigned to IQAC. A comprehensive report would be prepared and will be submitted for inclusion in the Annual Quality Assurance Report (AQAR).

The Chairperson appreciated the efforts of the organizing team and all members involved in executing the FDP effectively.

The conference-cum-workshop successfully achieved the following outcomes:


- Promoted **international and interdisciplinary collaboration**


## MULTIVERSE LECTURE ON SKIN HEALTH AND GROOMING


## Valedictory Session and Outcomes
